### "METAMORPHOSIS" Events Reveal the Future of the Foundation

A series of "METAMORPHOSIS" events were held last month to showcase the progress and reveal the future path of Goldman Philanthropic Partnerships. The events were well attended by many friends of the Foundation. Researchers from the past and present joined C.E.O., Dr. Bruce Bloom, and founders George and Judy Goldman, in a presentation explaining the Foundation's mission, history and direction. Dr. Bloom described the organization's transition from a private operating foundation to a public charity in 2004. The public charity will likely have a new name and an independent Board of Directors.

By late 2004, the new public charity will actively manage at least thirty-five research projects with a total budget of \$2.5 million dollars. By 2008, the plan is to fund at least \$5 million dollars of research at more than forty of the finest research institutions in the world.

Goldman Philanthropic Partnerships has fifteen innovative research projects in its 2003 portfolio and has secured more than 75% of the \$1.5 million dollars in funding from individual, donors, donor pools, institutional and organizational partnerships.
